In February the Russians will deploy a 25 meter reflector and direct it's reflected sunlight Earthward. The light should be 10 times brighter than the Moon. They hope to be able to build even larger reflectors to illuminate the Arctic regions of Siberia.

The Dark Sky Association of Tucson is against the project citing light pollution environmental impact, and the potential to use the technology to create advertising in space, and the inability of individuals to choose their own type of illumination.
